Who does what at Superbowl?

There is confusion amongst some members about who does what and who has what responsibilities at Superbowl.

Basically Superbowl is a privately owned business and the owners/managers have total control over the business side. This includes management of the buildings and the bowling green. They set the prices for drinks, food, membership and all bowling fees. They pay for all construction work and for the

bowling green and therefore have total control over the use of the green including rink settings.

Open Tournaments are the responsibility of the owners including such events as the Pro-Am's and they have total control of open sessions.

The Committee represent members interests but have limited powers. They organize Club Days, League Teams, Club Championships and Social Events e.g. Christmas

Dinner Dances. The owners allow the Committee to vet prospective new members but this is purely advisory as the owners can accept or reject anyone they wish.

Last of the Summer Wine is an independent Bowls Society, very much like a golf society, they have had a regular booking for three mornings a week for over 20 years. They are totally independent of "The Club" and manage their own affairs.
